Athletic Training Education Program (ATEP)

All students planning to become certified athletic trainers must apply for and be admitted to the Athletic Training Clinical Education Sequence at ISU. Transfer students will be evaluated individually based on previous course work and credentials. Eligibility to apply will be determined by the Director of Athletic Training. Applicants compete for available spaces in the program.

In addition to fulfilling University requirements, a Physical Education major wishing to apply for the Athletic Training Clinical Education Sequence must have verified the following:

- Completion of BIO 109 and 110 (SVCC courses) and HPR 188 and HPR 188.01 (ISU courses)
- A minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA and a minimum 2.75 major GPA must be earned.
- Personal interview with the program coordinator.
- Completed application for admittance to ATEP

The admission deadline for the ATEP program is November 30th of each year, with admission to the program occurring only in January of each year for the fall semester.

Teacher Education

Students may seek Illinois teacher certification in K-12 Physical Education. Many students seek endorsement enabling them to teach in an additional content areas such as health education, biology, science, social science, or mathematics.

Admission to Teacher Education-Physical Education major is selective. Students must fulfill Teacher Education program requirements for admission to the Teacher Education sequence. A minimum cumulative and major GPA of 2.5 is required. A departmental application for admission to the Teacher Education program is completed after transfer in conjunction with an ISU departmental advisor.

Students are encouraged to complete the T.A.P. (Test of Academic Proficiency formerly the Basic Skills Test) or have a score of 22 on the ACT with writing prior to transfer. For this reason, students should take the TAP or ACT as early as possible. Registration materials including test dates/deadlines available on the following websites: www.icts.nesinc.com or www.act.org. Students need to make sure scores are sent to ISU or they will need to bring a paper copy.

Teacher Education majors must have a grade of C or above in all coursework required as part of their licensure program. This includes all endorsement areas, major courses and professional education.

Exercise Science

Highly selective major; minimum CGPA 3.1 to be considered

Recreation and Park Administration

Two sequences available: Recreation Management or Therapeutic Recreation.
Minimum CGPA to be considered for admission: 2.0.

IMPORTANT NOTE FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS (Athletic Training & Teacher Certification only):

Students completing an Associate of Arts/Science Degree prior to transferring to ISU should know that the ATEP and Physical Education Teacher Certification program will take a minimum of three years to complete after transfer due to course sequencing and clinical experiences.

Some students may opt to complete one year at SVCC and/or the general education core curriculum then transfer to ISU to begin the athletic training courses in their sophomore year. However, students who transfer without the degree or general education core have additional general education courses to complete after transfer.

It is recommended that SVCC students complete BIO 109 and BIO 110 prior to transferring to ISU.
