MIDDLE LEVEL EDUCATION PROGRAM AT ILLINOIS STATE UNIVERSITY

The Middle Level Teacher Education program at Illinois State will prepare the student with a unique expertise in teaching young adolescents with a primary focus on grades 5-8. Middle level education majors must complete two teaching specializations in his/her baccalaureate program. Specializations include Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Sciences, and Science:

SVCC course recommendations by Area of Specialization1: Eight or more total courses required in each area.

Language Arts: ENG 103; ENG 225 or 226; ENG 227 or 228

Mathematics: MAT 203

Social Sciences: ECO 211 or 212; GOV 163; GEO 122; HIS 131 or 132; HIS 221 or 222

Science: BIO 103 or 105; CHE 103 or 105; PHY 175 or 201 or 211

Students are admitted to the Middle Level Education program on a competitive and selective basis.

Prospective transfer students are encouraged to file an Application for Admission to ISU EARLY (one year in advance) or as soon as possible during the priority filing period (subject to change) as posted in the Undergraduate ISU Application. Applications postmarked during the priority filing period have an advantage when space is limited. The University reserves the right to curtail admission, adjust requirements, and limit enrollment due to space limitations, therefore, it may not be possible to offer admission to all qualified applicants.

Admission Requirements and Selection Criteria for Middle Level Education:

NEW TRANSFER STUDENTS must have a **minimum cumulative transfer GPA of 2.75

** The cumulative grade-point average will be re-calculated upon transfer to ISU generally using all grades from all colleges and universities attended. However, for repeated courses, only the last repeated grade will be used for calculation for admission. Also, remedial course grades will not be used for admission purposes.

Students are encouraged to complete the T.A.P. (Test of Academic Proficiency formerly the Basic Skills Test) or have an ACT with writing composite score of 22 or higher with a minimum of 19 in "combined English/Writing score" prior to transfer. For this reason, students should take the TAP or ACT as early as possible. Registration materials including test dates/deadlines available on the following websites: www.icts.nesinc.com or www.act.org. Students need to make sure scores at sent to ISU or they will need to bring a paper copy.

Teacher Education majors must have a grade of C or above in all coursework required as part of their licensure program. This includes all endorsement areas, major courses and professional education.

Please be advised that there may be times when more students desire admission into the Middle Level Education program than can be accommodated. Neither formal admission to Illinois State University, nor acceptance into the College of Education, guarantee immediate enrollment into courses for this program.
