Psychology – Illinois State University

Psychology is a scientific discipline with a focus on the behavior of individuals. Psychology is also a profession that applies scientific principles to special problems. The undergraduate major is a broad and flexible Liberal Arts and Sciences major, and students will have an opportunity to learn aspects of both the science and the profession of psychology. This major is designed to provide a foundation for living as well as foundation for careers.

The department currently has over 500 majors; therefore, <u>admission to the Major is very selective</u>. Due to the popularity of psychology as a major at Illinois State, the department cannot accept all the applications it receives.

The following are requirements that transfer students must meet in order to be admitted to the PSY major at ISU:

- 2.5 Transfer GPA (Note: The cumulative grade-point average will be re-calculated upon transfer to ISU generally
 using all grades from all colleges and universities attended. However, for repeated courses, only the last repeated grade
 will be used for calculation for admission. Also, remedial course grades will not be used for admission purposes.)
- Grades of C or better in PSY 103 and MAT 220, 221 or 203
- A laboratory science course with a grade of C or better

Other Recommendations: Apply Early and complete math BEFORE transferring to ISU.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT: All graduates (B.A. and B.S.) of the College of Arts and Sciences (including Psychology) must satisfy a foreign language requirement that may be met by: 3 years of one foreign language in high school or completion of the second semester or higher of college-level foreign language with a grade of C or better or equivalent proficiency as determined by examination.

As a Psychology major, students can choose to pursue a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) or a Bachelor of Science (B.S.).

B.A. – Students must complete the Foreign Language requirement in addition to the math/science requirements in general education as outlined on the front of this sheet. For a BA, students must complete the equivalent of three semesters of foreign language in college. Both CLEP credit and high school credit are NOT allowed. Students may choose to take a proficiency exam for foreign language at SVCC or ISU.

B.S. – Student must complete an additional 3-hour course in natural sciences, mathematics, statistics, and/or technology beyond those required for general education as outlined on the front of this sheet. SVCC approved courses: AGR 109, BIO 111, 120, 123, 131; BUS 214; CHE 106, 201; MAT 150, 204, 205, 221, 230, 231, 240; PHY 202, 212, 221

All courses taken to fulfill a requirement for the Psychology major MUST be taken for a letter grade.

* Global Studies Requirement: All students must complete ONE course in Global Studies to fulfill an ISU graduation requirement. Choose from one of the following courses to fulfill this requirement (These courses are marked with an asterisk on the front of this sheet.)
