Students may transfer in PSY 103 plus 6 additional major elective hours chosen from: PSY 200, 214, 215 and EDU 220. Any additional psychology hours accepted in transfer are applicable toward the 120-semester-hour graduation requirement.

- B.A. majors <u>Foreign Language Requirement</u>: Must demonstrate competence in a foreign language equivalent to that attained in 2 years of college instruction (4 semesters) or 4 years of a foreign language with no grade lower than a C in high school.

NOTE: Students are still required to complete one Life science and one Physical science course as a SVCC graduation requirement.

<u>Teacher Educator Licensure</u>: Students who want to be licensed to teach psychology/social sciences must declare their intention to do so with the office of teacher certification in the Department of History at the earliest possible opportunity. Licensure involves significant requirements in addition to the completion of a degree in psychology, including the minimum requirements for teaching endorsements in Both U.S. history and world history.
