Accountancy majors must complete ACC 101 and ACC 102 with at least a C.

At the completion of the Bachelors of Business degree with a major in Accountancy, students may sit for the CMA (Certified Management Accountant) or the CFM (Certified Financial Manager) exams. Students wishing to sit for the CPA (Certified Public Accountant) exam in Illinois are required to complete 150 hours of education after the year 2000. The combined Bachelor degree and Master of Accountancy will provide students with the 150 hours necessary to sit for the CPA exam.
