Students transferring without the AA or AS Degree may need to complete different general education courses.

Only one course noted with the same letter subscript can be used for Humanities/Fine Arts credit.

Interdisciplinary courses encompassing both the humanities and fine arts may be used for both categories.

*Major Core Courses -- It is recommended that students complete these courses prior to transfer.

##Recommended electives include courses that apply toward a **required minor or a second major**. Recommended minors include Accountancy, Business (general), Computer Science, Economics, Finance, Foreign Language, Management (Human Resource, Information, Operations, or General), Marketing (**ACC 101 and 102 or ACC 101 and ECO 211 required to enroll in WIU marketing program), Mathematics, Military Science, Professional Writing, Public Communications & Human Relations, or Statistics.

Additional CJS courses can be taken in this area as long as they transfer to WIU, but will be accepted as ELECTIVES ONLY and not as requirements for the major.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON THE BACKSIDE!

Law Enforcement and Justice Administration -- Western Illinois University

The LEJA program at WIU is the largest undergraduate law enforcement program in Illinois and the region. Students pursuing this course of study receive a Bachelor of Science degree in Law Enforcement and Justice Administration. The program is designed to provide professional knowledge, understanding, and skills for criminal justice and loss prevention personnel and, at the same time, develop an educational base for further development into staff and administrative positions in criminal justice and private security agencies. The program allows the student ample flexibility for liberal and professional education to meet the anticipated needs of the criminal justice network. All majors in the program participate in an internship for one academic semester to gain firsthand acquaintance with criminal justice agencies at the federal, state, county, and local levels. Graduates find employment in city, county, state, and federal agencies, in private security, corrections, fire service, and in adult and juvenile court services. The undergraduate program is offered in Macomb and Quad Cities (Moline, IL)

****Mathematics Requirement**

For students interested in becoming a state of Illinois police officer, SIX hours of college level mathematics is required. This requirement is now satisfied by completion of an IAI approved mathematics course and LEJA 303 at WIU. MAT 240 at SVCC will provide a background in statistics which can assist with LEJA 303 content.
