Social Work -- Western Illinois University

The **Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.)** degree program is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education. The B.S.W. prepares students as generalist social workers for entry level professional employment in social service agencies, providing services to individuals, families, groups, organizations, neighborhoods, and communities. Generalist social workers serve children, adolescents, adults, and elderly persons with a variety of needs. The Social Work curriculum provides students with the opportunity to obtain the knowledge, values, and skills needed for beginning professional practice and for continuation of their studies at the graduate level. This curriculum is built upon and integrates the liberal arts through the basic University General Education requirements.

All students enter social work as a pre-social major (PSW). To be formally admitted to the program as a Social Work (SCLWK) major, students must complete an interview with a faculty member and complete the application packet demonstrating fulfillment of or substantial progress in the following:

Social Work Major Admission Requirements

- 1. Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better
- 30 semester hours of credit to include: SOC 200 with a grade of C or better (3 hrs.) BIO 103 (4 hrs.) ENG 101 (3 hrs.) PSY 103 (3 hrs.) SOC 111 (3 hrs.)
- Provide acceptable documentation of a minimum of 100 hours of volunteer or paid human service experience, such as direct experience with persons using the services provided in medical settings, day care centers, nursing homes, church-related programs, or other similar settings.
- Complete the Social Work Program application materials, have a personal interview with a member of the Social Work faculty, and complete the Social Work Assessment Exam.
- 5. Be accepted, on the basis of the application process, by the Social Work faculty. If the application is denied, the student has the right to appeal to the chairperson. The department will consider the appeal as a committee of the whole.

Application Information

The Social Work application will require several writing samples on topics relative to the major including a paper on the student's volunteer/work experiences, the Social Work code of ethics, cheating/ plagiarism, and a personal assessment. The application also includes an interview with a WIU department member. Students interested in this major should contact the department **prior** to transfer in order to complete the application process in a timely manner.
