Associate in Arts or Associate in Science Degree

Effective for students starting at WIU Fall 2016 or after STUDENTS ATTEMPTING TO COMPLETE THIS PROGRAM IN A TIMELIER MANNER SHOULD CONSIDER TRANSFERRING TO WIU AFTER 2 or 3 SEMESTERS AT SVCC (GENERAL EDUCATION CORE CURRICULUM IDEALLY COMPLETED) AND BEGIN COURSEWORK IN THEIR SOPHOMORE YEAR AT WIU. Special Education -- Western Illinois University

Students who successfully complete the B.S. degree in Education with a major in Special Education and pass applicable exams will qualify for an initial special education certificate with the following endorsement: Learning Behavior Specialist 1 (LBS 1) beginning July 2003. This generalist certificate provides background in seven

Learning Disabilities (LD), Mental Disabilities (EMH and TMH), Social/Emotional Disorders (BD), Physical Disabilities, Autism, Severe Brain Trauma and other Health Impairments.

Students holding an LBS 1 endorsement are qualified to teach exceptional children in the categories listed above at the elementary and/or high school levels (K – age 21). An additional early childhood special education approval is required to serve students in early childhood.

Transfer students must successfully complete the Illinois Certification Testing System (ICTS) - Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP) or ACT Plus Writing with a Composite Score of 22 or higher with a minimum of 19 in "combined English/Writing and be accepted to the Teacher Education Program to continue enrolling in departmental classes at WIU. It is highly recommended that students successfully complete the ICTS Testing requirement prior to transfer to WIU.

**Students who wish to work toward licensure in both Special Education and Elementary Education may do so as a Special Education major. Dual licensure students take all required Special Education courses as well as additional elementary content classes.

Important Note for Transfer Students: Students completing an Associate in Arts or an Associate in Science prior to transferring should know that the special education program will take a minimum of 6 years to complete (6-7 semesters after transfer) due to course sequencing and availability. Students attempting to complete this program in a timelier manner should consider transferring to WIU after 2 or 3 semesters at SVCC (general education core curriculum ideally completed) and begin coursework in their sophomore year at WIU. WIU is projecting a fall only start of this program beginning Fall 2016. See an academic advisor for more information.
